


NEXT BOARD MEETING





In the past, those of us hungering for an intense educational experience that includes the chance to witness hands-on demonstrations and watch clinicians work with horses and riders have had to travel to Massachusetts, or beyond. The heated indoor arena at Treasure allows this same sort of opportunity to take root in central Maine. And when the brain begins to feel a little too tired and full, there will be fun equine shopping opportunities provided by an array of vendors.


A multidisciplinary event such as this will have something for everybody. For example, we are all concerned about the well-being of our horses, and the Expo showcases pertinent healing arts, including dentistry, massage, saddle fitting, soft tissue adjustments, innovative farrier work, and veterinarian commentary on various pathways in “alternative” therapies, and even spiritualism and the work of an “animal communicator.” There are demonstrations from the field of natural horsemanship and education about the ingredients of effective riding instruction.

In terms of the interest’s central to dressage and combined training, Ida Anderson will offer three sessions in classical long reining. She also invites competitors to come and try riding the new USDF tests, with her as judge/instructor. In addition, Olympic-level dressage and jumping trainer Jean Luc Cornille will convey the foundations of biomechanics and will illustrate new, non-invasive computer technology that reveals equine balance.

For a full list of clinicians, events and vendors, go to the Treasure Equestrian Center website (www.treasureeques.com). It takes you immediately into a short and fun infomercial that allows you to glimpse several of the participating clinicians at work.

Events will run from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Friday through Sunday and advance ticket sales (\$20 per day or \$50 for all 3 days) will be offered until the 26th of February. After that date and at the door, the cost of admission will be \$25 per day or \$60 for the entire event. Children under 9 years of age are free. No pets or strollers please.
